



NOTTINGHAM DRINKER SUPPLEMENT

Including The Vale of Belvoir Mild in May Ale Trail



Your Nottingham Drinker supplement contains two trails. There is the Nottingham Trail with 31 pubs all situated within easy reach of the city centre. There is also the Vale of Belvoir Trail with 18 pubs all within the Vale area.

This year there are no less than 16 pubs all within less than half mile radius of the Market Square and a further 7 within a mile radius. For the first time there is the opportunity to visit pubs by tram with 11 pubs only minutes away from a tram stop.

If you've never tried Mild, now is your chance to appreciate the wide variety of Milds available and also try a few pubs you may not have been to before. Over 100 people completed the Nottingham trail again last year, making it another successful event, why not join them?

There is an impressive range of Light and Dark Milds to be savoured, produced by breweries from all over the country. There are several brewed locally including Hardys & Hansons Kimberley Mild. Nottingham Rock Mild is being distributed to over 26 pubs locally during May and is also reaching further afield. Castle Rock Black Gold is to be found throughout the Tynemill Estate and in other outlets. Other local microbreweries also produce Milds and these will be found around the region during May. See how many different ones you can find.



The Plough, Radford

May 8th is National Mild Day, an even better excuse to try a drop of mild. Look out for further promotions on this day.

Each year we ask you which pub put on the best Mild Display and which sold the best pint (or half) of Mild.

The **Plough** at Radford retained the title for Best Pint, just beating the **Fox & Crown**, Basford who moved up from third place to second.

A new-comer to the Mild trail won first place for the Best Display; who could miss those dancing feet leading you to the Mild pump on the bar at the **Rose of England**. Second place went to the **Horse & Groom**, Basford, who featured their forthcoming Mild ales.

The **Newstead Abbey**, Bulwell, moved up from fourth to third, displaying their own colourful Mild posters. In fourth place was the **Fox & Crown**, Basford.

In addition we are continuing to give a **free pint** of mild to each entrant, redeemable at the 2004 Nottingham CAMRA Beer & Cider Festival which is to be held, as usual, at the Victoria Leisure Centre, Sneinton Market from Thursday 21st October to Sunday 24th.

All of the pubs we have selected for the trail are well served by public transport including many on the tram route; directions and bus numbers (or route colours) are given on the pubs list. Nottingham City Transport and TrentBartons offer good value for money day tickets as well as the usual longer term passes. So please

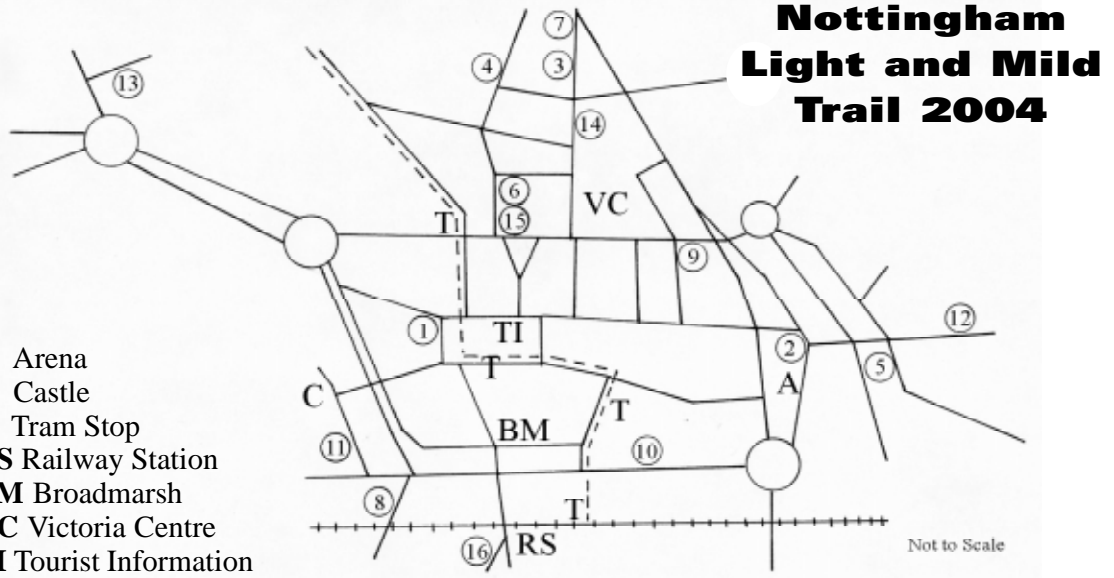

At the end of the month send your card by 12th June 2004 to Mr. E. Fendell, 5 Nottingham Road, Cropwell Bishop, Notts NG12 3BP. Completion certificates will be awarded as follows:-

18 pubs validated on sheet - Gold

12 pubs validated on sheet - Silver

8 pubs validated on sheet - Bronze

Whilst Landlords have tried to be as accurate as possible with dates given, if you are making a long or special journey to one of the pubs listed it is advisable to phone first to check on availability to avoid disappointment. If cask mild is not available at the listed pub during the dates given you are still able to have your card validated.

- Order a pint or half pint of **Cask Mild** in one of the participating pubs and ask for a Mild Sticker.
- Be patient if the pub is busy.
- Put the sticker on the appropriately named square on your Mild Trail form.
- Collect stickers from any 8 different pubs to qualify for the Bronze Certificate.
- Collect stickers from any 16 different pubs to qualify for the Silver Certificate.
- Gold Certificates are awarded to those mad enough to do all 31 pubs!
